Because Penn Community Bank donates \$10 for every checking account opened through Workplace Connections, Tynes' initiative also has generated \$5,000 for local nonprofits in the past year. The organizations that have benefitted from the program include Bucks County Opportunity Council, Bucks County SPCA, Central Bucks Family YMCA, Family Service Association of Bucks County, and Habitat for Humanity of Bucks County.

The 40 Under 40 award winners were honored at a dinner at SugarHouse Casino on May 10. They also were featured in a special May 11 issue of the Philadelphia Business Journal and highlighted at www.pbj.com.
